Components of the drainage basin hydrological system




The pattern of daytime temperatures for Greater London, UK, 8 August 2003



Age/sex pyramids for India, a country in South Asia, in 2001 and predicted for 2026





Percentage immigrant population in MEDCs and LEDCs in 1990, 2000 and 2010





