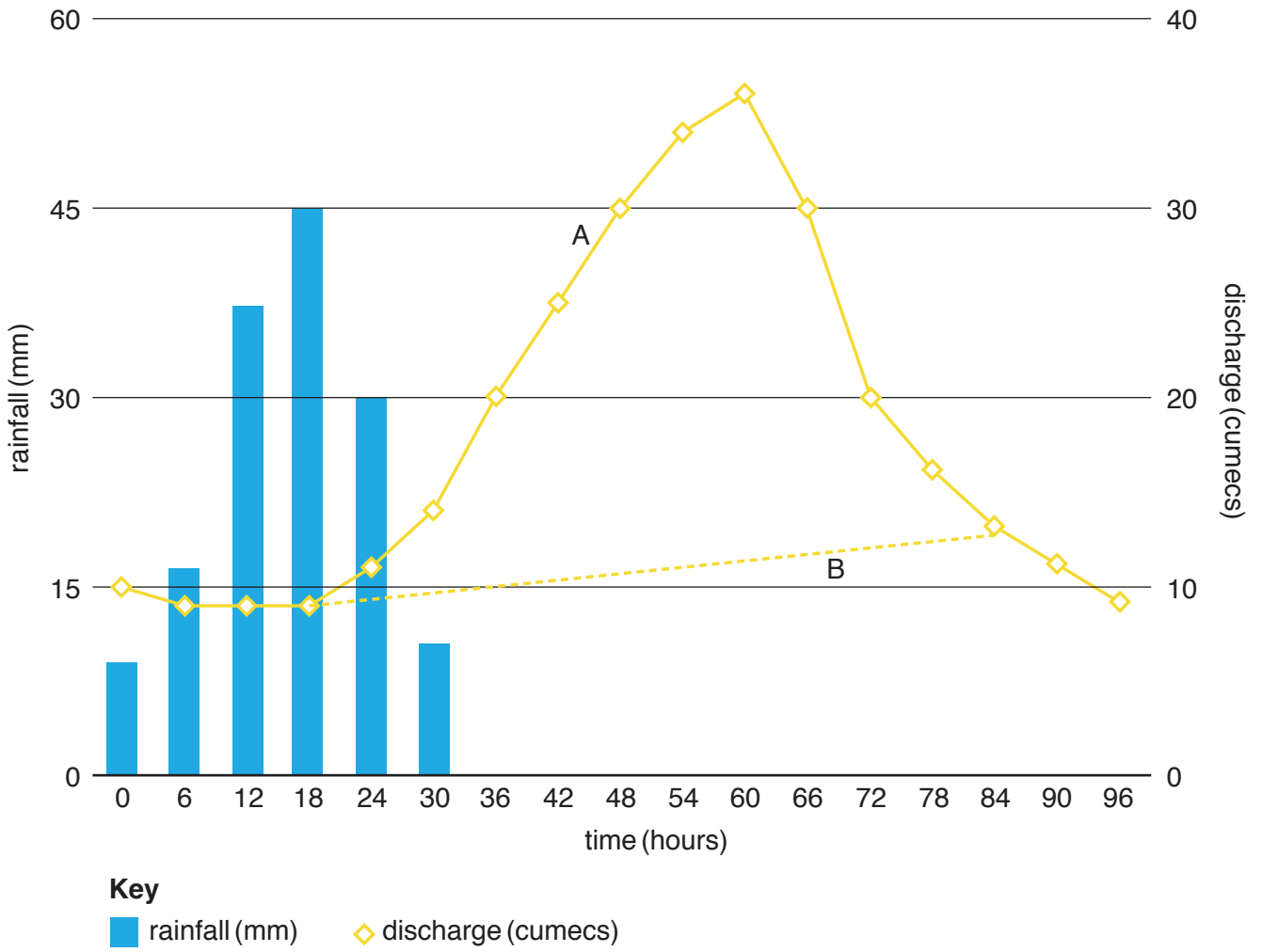

Some possible consequences of global warming

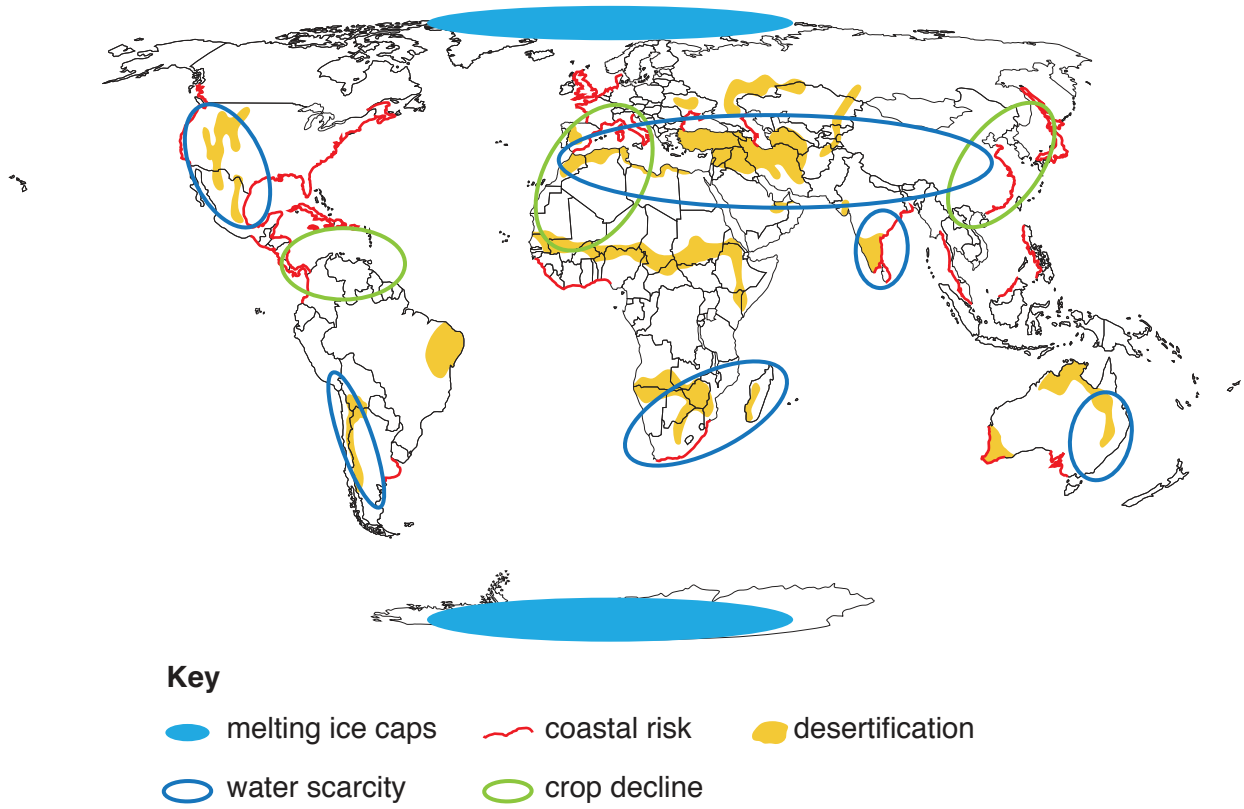

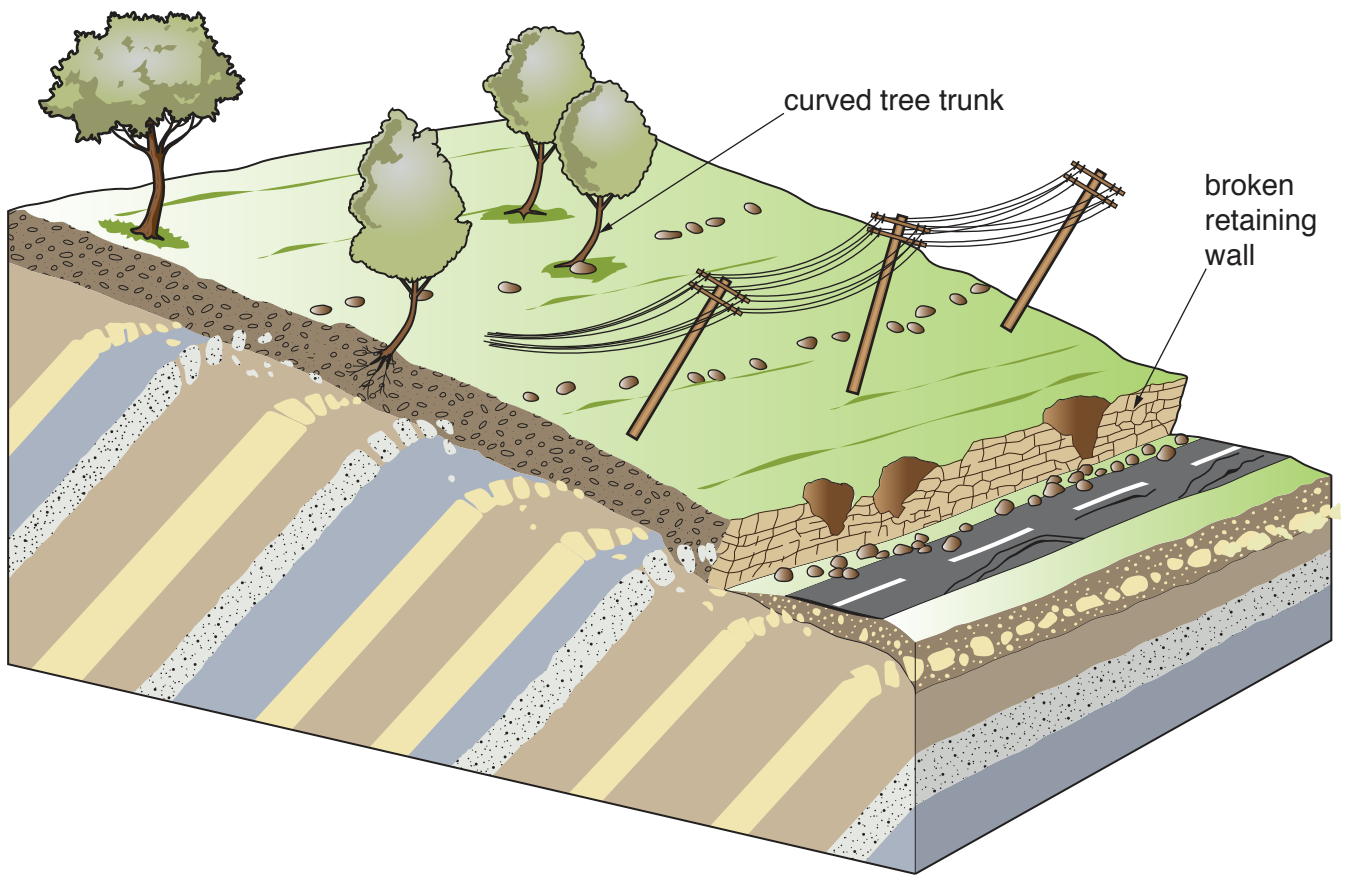

Average life expectancy for the world and life expectancy for India, a country in South Asia, 2000–14 and predicted 2015–49

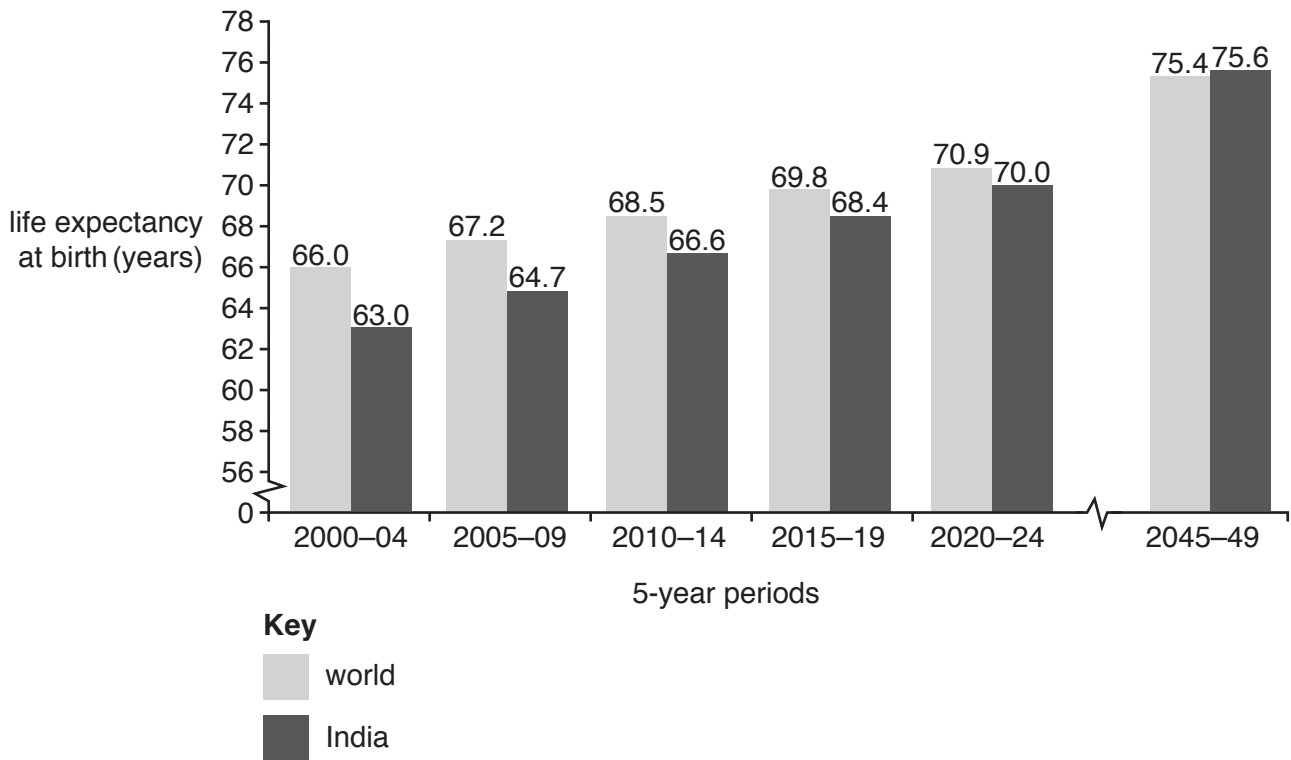
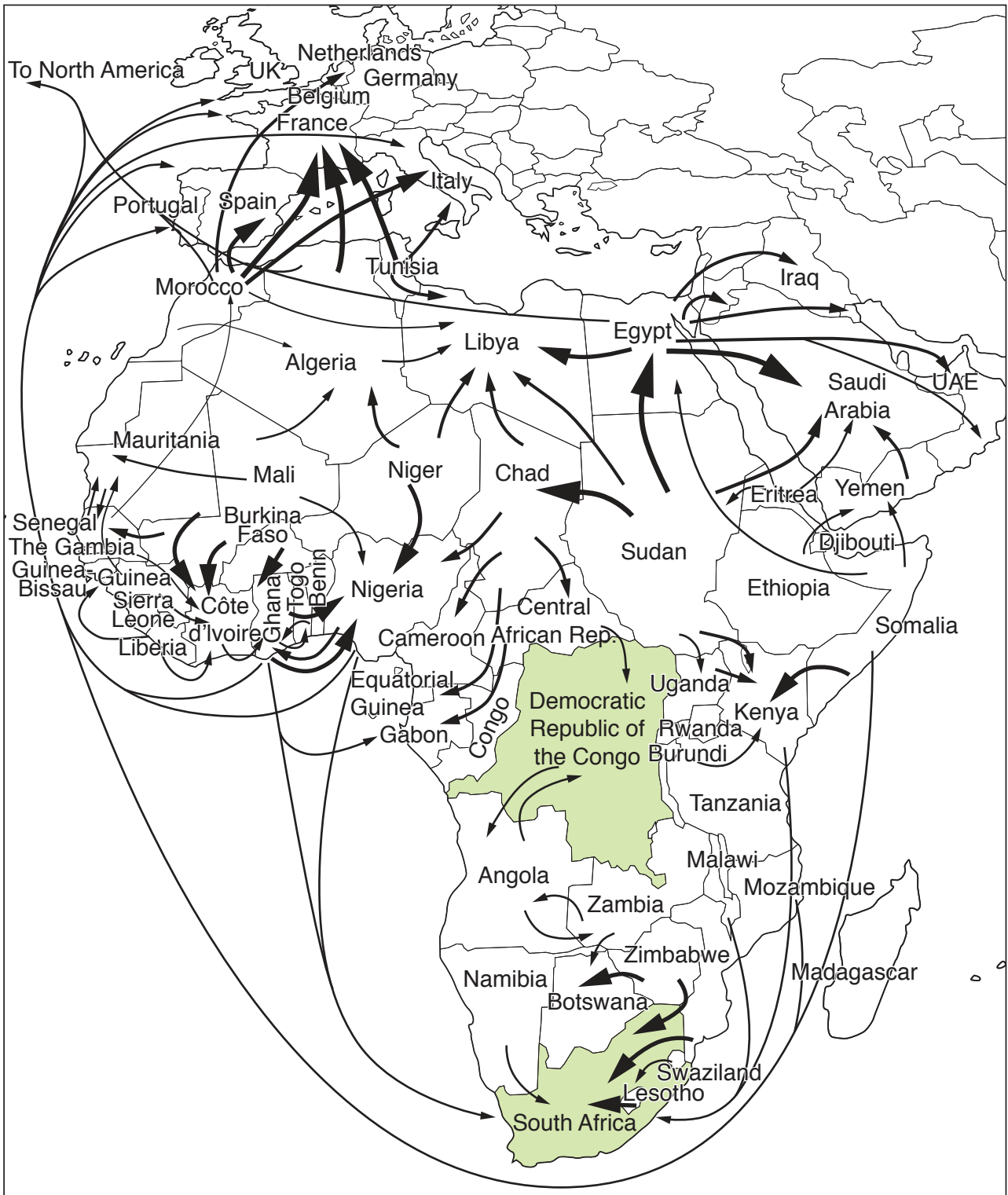
