In your answer, include the impact of the evidence on the author's argument. [15]

3 Study Documents A and B.

The two authors present different arguments and perspectives about protest movements.

Evaluate the arguments of both authors. In your answer, consider their perspectives and include a reasoned judgement about whether one argument is stronger than the other. [25]
