Write brief answers to Question 1, using short sentences or bullet points. Write your answers to Question 2 and Question 3 in continuous prose.

1 Study Documents A and B.

(a) The author of Document A argues for a reduction in meat consumption to protect the environment.

Identify **three** of the planet's most serious environmental challenges, as given by the author of Document A. [3]

(b) The author of Document B argues that veganism is not the only solution to the climate crisis.

Identify **two examples** of environments that are not suitable for growing vegetables, as given by the author of Document B. [2]

2 Study Document A.

Assess the strengths and weaknesses of the evidence used by the author of Document A to support their argument that a reduction in meat consumption is needed to protect the environment.

In your answer, include the impact of the evidence on the author's argument. [15]

3 Study Documents A and B.

The authors of the two documents present different arguments and perspectives about the role of veganism in solving the climate crisis.

Evaluate the arguments of the authors of both documents. In your answer, consider their perspectives and include a reasoned judgement about whether one argument is stronger than the other. [25]
