Model linking agricultural change to inequalities between farmers

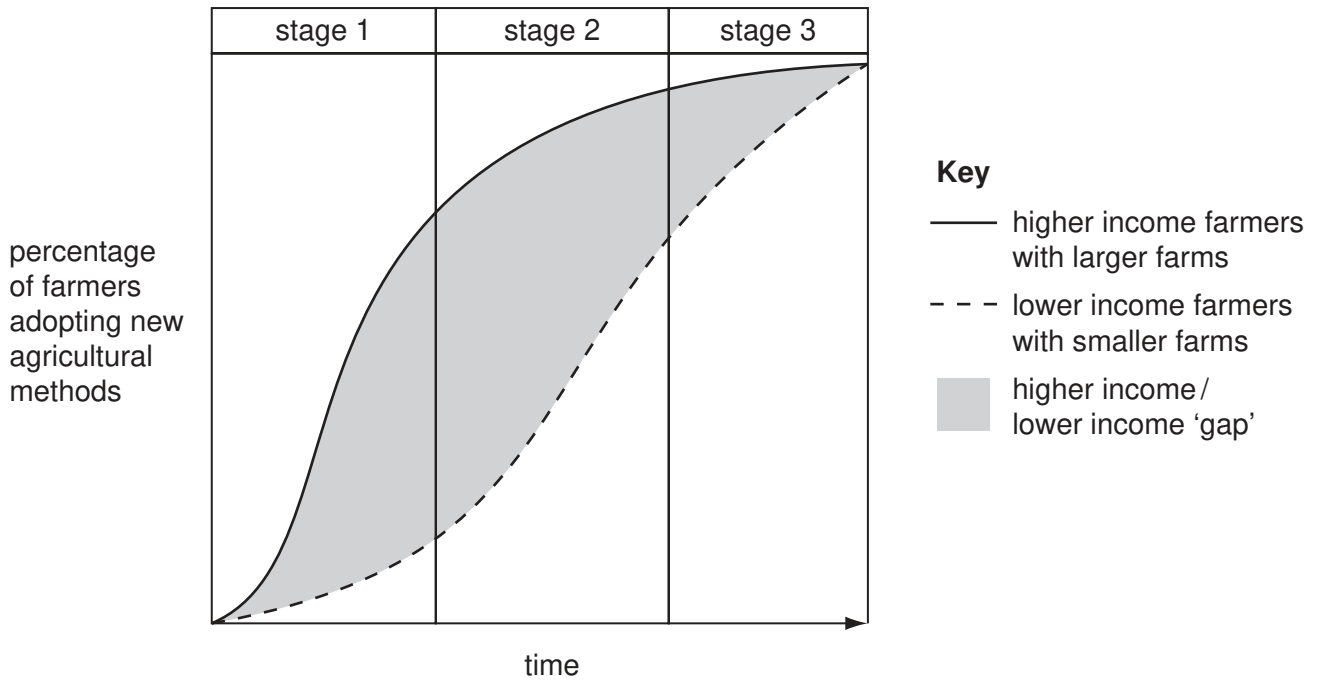

Global consumption of coal, 1997 and 2007

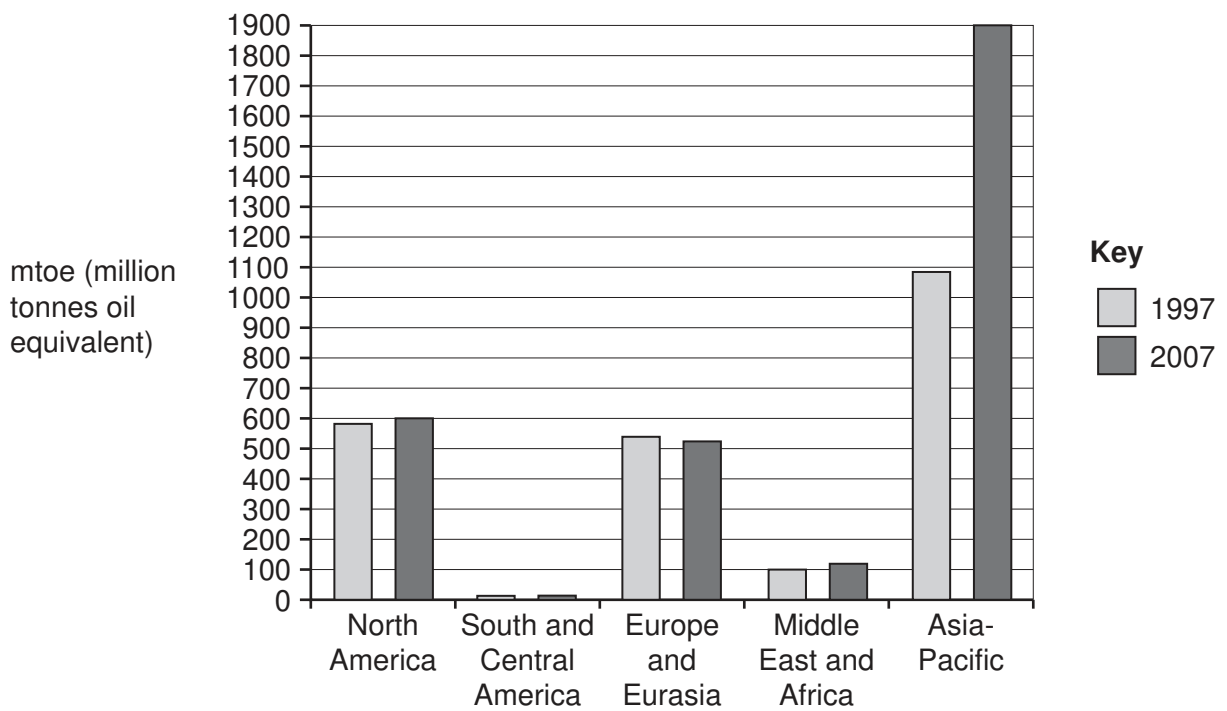
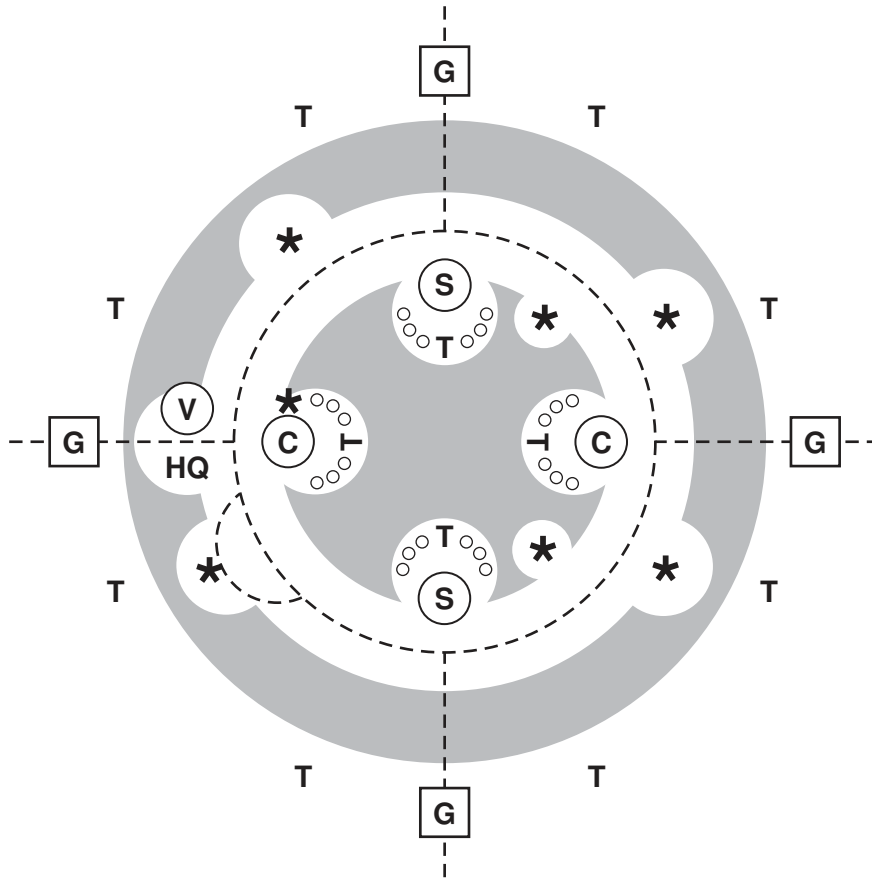








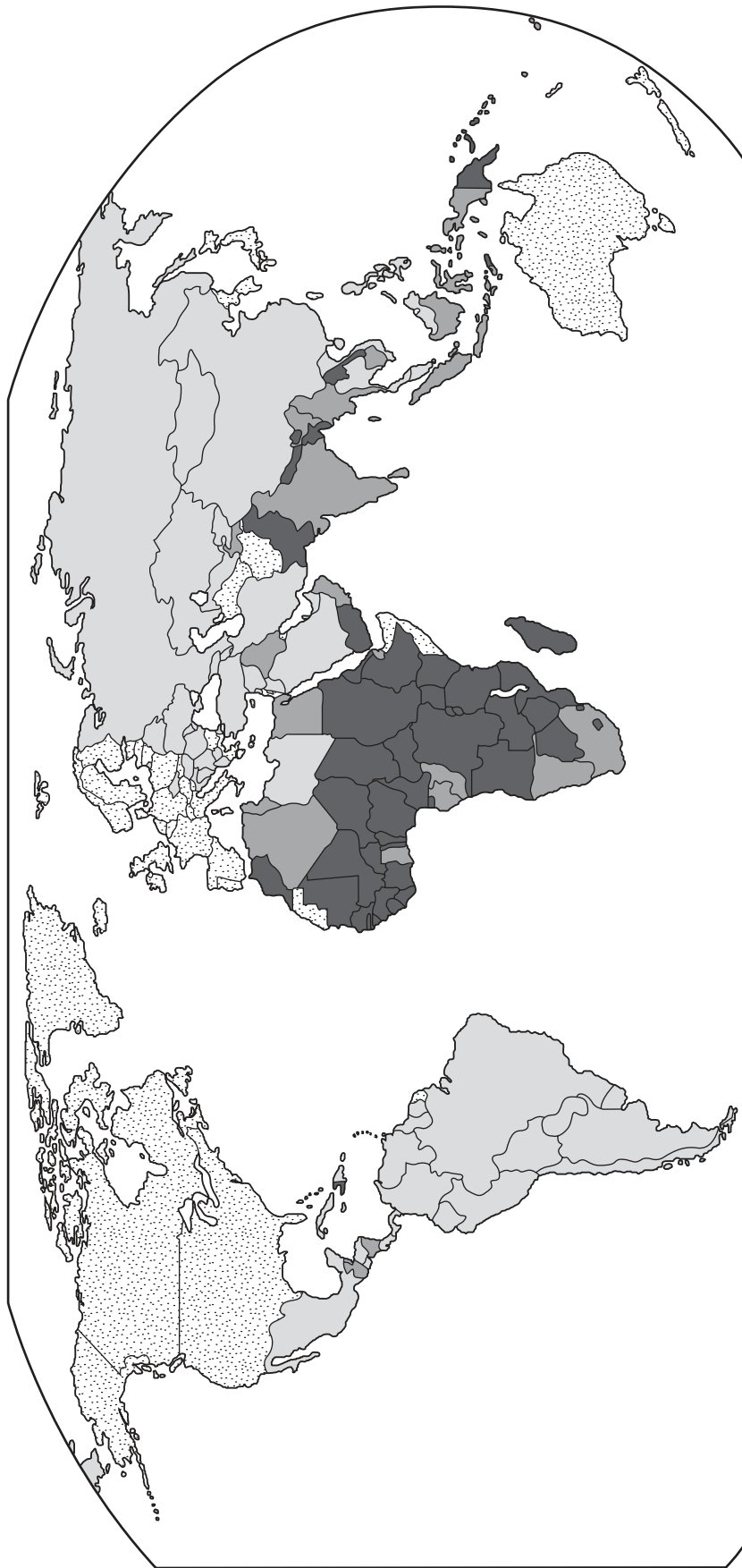
