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#### General information about practical exams

Centres must follow the guidance on science practical exams given in the Cambridge Handbook.

#### Safety

Supervisors must follow national and local regulations relating to safety and first aid.

Only those procedures described in the question paper should be attempted.

Supervisors must inform candidates that materials and apparatus used in the exam should be treated with caution. Suitable eye protection should be used where necessary.

Hazard data sheets relating to substances used in this exam should be available from your chemical supplier.

#### Before the exam

- The packets containing the question papers must **not** be opened before the exam.
- It is assumed that standard school laboratory facilities, as indicated in the *Guide to Planning Practical Science*, will be available.
- Spare materials and apparatus for the tasks set must be available for candidates, if required.

## **During the exam**

- It must be made clear to candidates at the start of the exam that they may request spare materials and apparatus for the tasks set.
- Where specified, the supervisor must perform the experiments and record the results as instructed. This must be done out of sight of the candidates, using the same materials and apparatus as the candidates.
- Any assistance provided to candidates must be recorded in the supervisor's report.
- If any materials or apparatus need to be replaced, for example, in the event of breakage or loss, this must be recorded in the supervisor's report.

# After the exam

- The supervisor must complete a report for each practical session held and each laboratory used.

# **Preparation of materials**

2% albumen suspension

This is prepared by putting 2g of egg albumen in 80 cm<sup>3</sup> of distilled water and stirring until dissolved. Make up to 100 cm<sup>3</sup> with distilled water.

1% protease solution C, HH, MH

This is prepared by putting 1g bacterial protease  $\mathbf{C}$ ,  $\mathbf{HH}$ ,  $\mathbf{MH}$ , into  $80\,\mathrm{cm}^3$  of distilled water and mixing until dissolved. Make up to  $100\,\mathrm{cm}^3$  with distilled water.

This should be prepared on the day of the exam.

biuret solution C

A commercially prepared biuret solution suitable for standard food tests can be used.

#### Question 2
