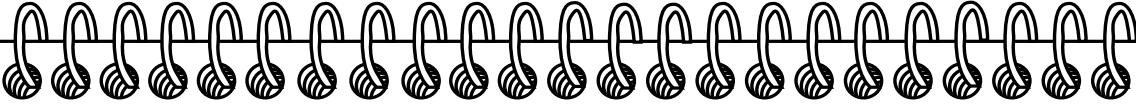

Bollywood Foley Artist

Foley Artist: a sound in the film industry [1]

Tasks: to add sound after filming, when recording is spoilt by noise of traffic, or in the background to improve the quality of the soundtrack [1]

How to create convincing sounds:

swords clashing – bang together sticks made of metal

swords falling onto hard floor – drop pots onto [1]

a fire – crush sheets of [1]

Foley Artist sometimes called a 'walker' or 'stepper': makes the sounds of footsteps

Has to consider:

the surface – sand, snow or [1]


the mood of the character – angry, happy, or in a panic

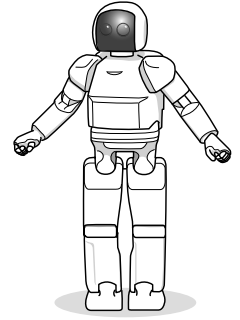
