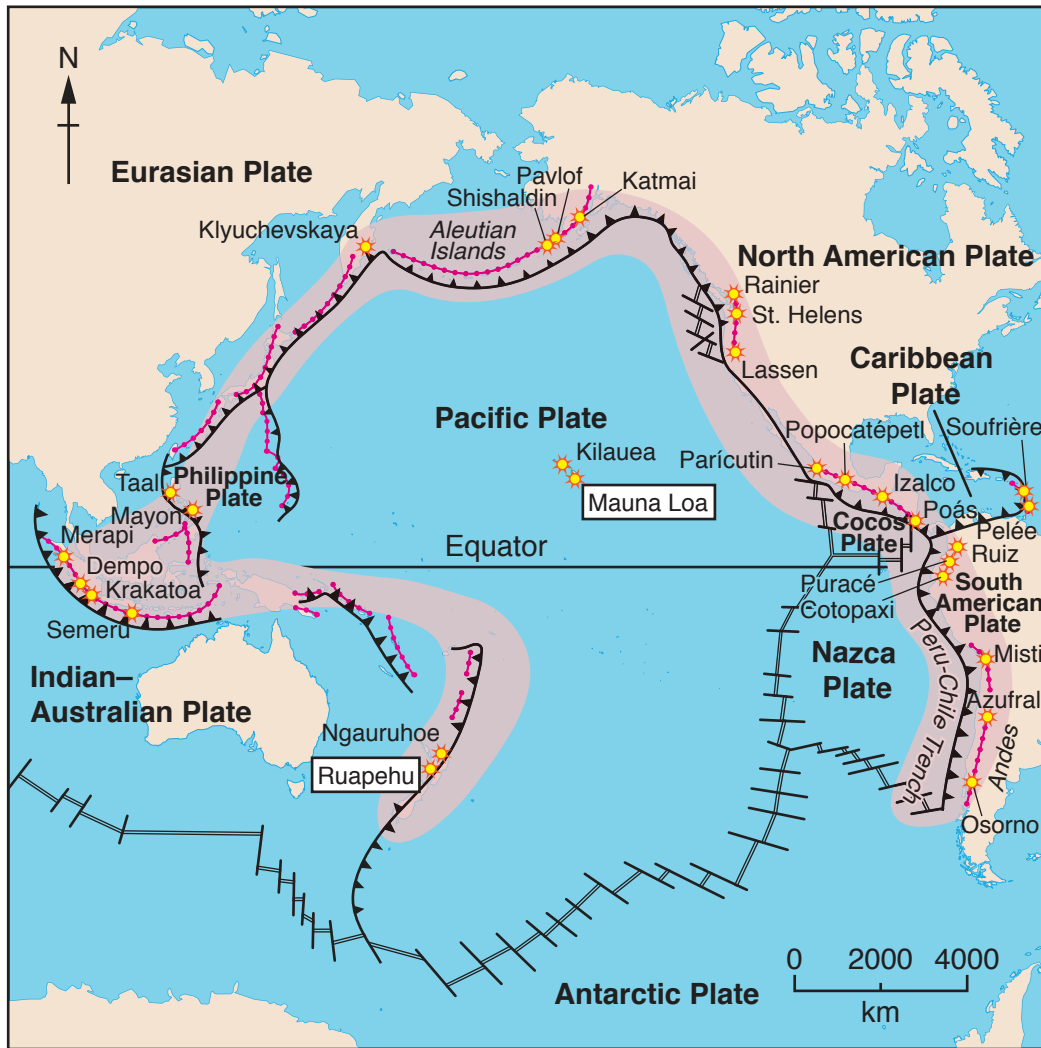


Fig. 3.1 for Question 3

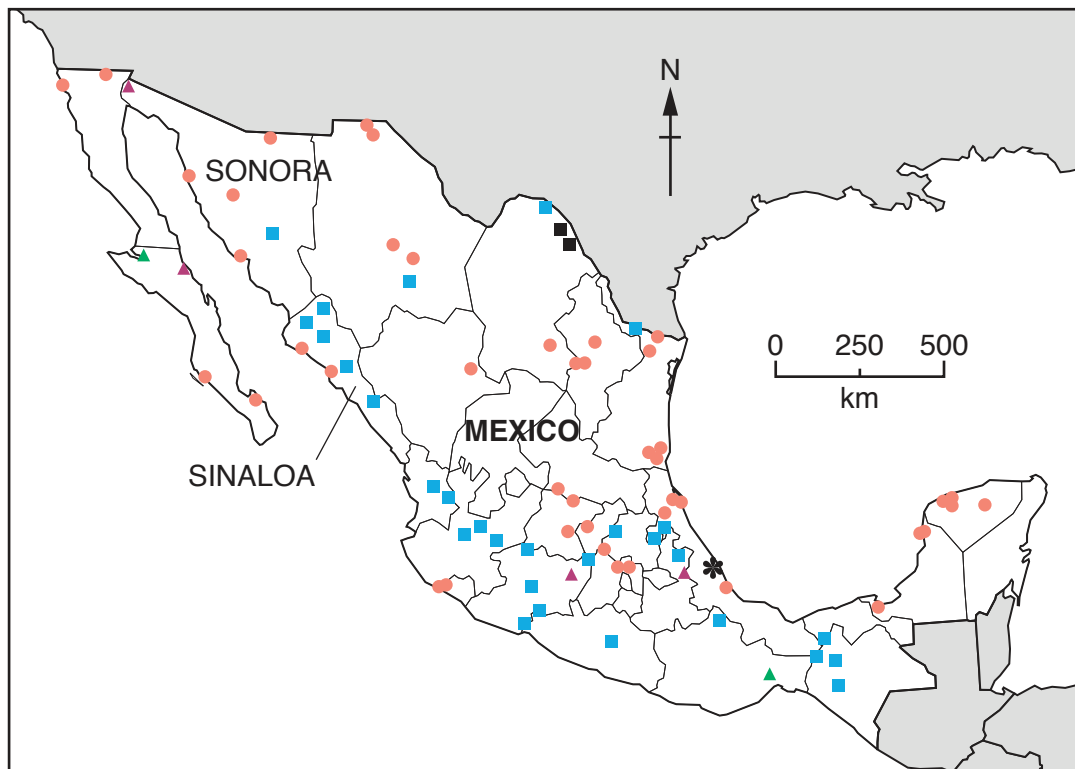
