- (b) Explain why Papal audiences might be important to some Christians. [6]
- (c) Discuss whether going on pilgrimage is an important duty for all Christians.

- (c) Assess the significance of the role of the imam in different Muslim communities.

- (ii) Outline **two** of the Six Articles of Faith. [4]

- (c) Evaluate different views on the importance of the Shahadah in Muslim life.

- (ii) Outline the historic importance of Madinah for Muslims. [4]

- (c) Evaluate whether overcoming physical challenges is the most important part of Muslim pilgrimage.

- 7 (a) (i) Identify **two** things a Jew might do to honour the dead at Yad Vashem. [2]
- (ii) Outline spiritual goals Jews might have for a pilgrimage to the site of the Temple. [4]
- (b) Explain how the Ark **and** the ner tamid being in the synagogue might remind Jews of the Temple. [6]
- (c) Evaluate different Jewish views on the importance of remembering the Holocaust. [8]

- 8 (a) (i) Name what is kept in the aron ha-kodesh, **and** name the place in the synagogue this is read from. [2]

- (c) Discuss whether ritual dress is a necessary aspect of worship for all Jews. [8]
