Tourism in Wales, UK

In recent years, occupancy rates in hotels, guesthouses, bed and breakfasts (B&B) and self-catering units in Wales have risen.

The Wales Occupancy Survey has revealed that occupancy rates for guesthouses and B&B's have increased by 3%, while the rate for self-catering units increased by 4% to 46% occupancy.

The Wales Tourism Office Minister said: "Recent figures show that the volume of nights spent in Wales by domestic visitors is up 17%".

The National Tourist Board for Wales, VisitWales, has recently run a campaign to encourage domestic tourists to visit Wales. This campaign is said to have generated £240m in additional expenditure for the economy of Wales, up 36% on the previous year.

The Wales Tourism Office Minister added: "Tourism is an essential part of the economy in Wales – employing over 140,000 people, making up 10% of jobs in Wales and generating millions of pounds of spending for Wales."
