- 1 (a) Read the following passage and then answer the questions:

**Genesis 17:9–10, NRSVA**

God said to Abraham, 'As for you, you shall keep my covenant, you and your offspring after you throughout their generations. This is my covenant, which you shall keep, between me and you and your offspring after you: Every male among you shall be circumcised.'

- (i) Give Abraham's name before God made the covenant with him. [1]
- (ii) State how old God said that males should be when they are circumcised. [1]
- (iii) Describe what God said to Abraham about Sarai. [4]
- (b) Explain the importance of the covenant with Abraham in God's overall plan for humanity. [6]
- (c) 'A God of love should not need to make covenants with his people.' Discuss. [8]

- 2 (a) Read the following passage and then answer the questions:

**Jonah 3:4, NRSVA**

Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!'

- (i) State what the people of Nineveh did when they heard this message and believed God. [2]
- (ii) Describe the proclamation that the king made in Nineveh. [4]
- (b) Explain possible reasons why Jonah became angry with God. [6]
- (c) Assess the view that God will always change his mind when people pray. [8]

- 3** (a) Outline God's instructions to Moses after he had revealed his name, **and** state what God said about how the elders of Israel would respond. [6]
- (b) Explain the importance of Moses for Christians today. [6]

- 4** (a) Outline Paul's teaching about the message of the cross in 1 Corinthians. [6]
- (b) Explain how Paul's audience in Corinth might have understood this teaching. [6]
- (c) To what extent is Paul's teaching about the message of the cross relevant to Christians today? [8]

- 5** (a) Describe Peter's vision when he was in Joppa. [6]
- (b) Explain why this vision was significant to the early church. [6]
- (c) Assess the view that this vision has nothing to teach modern-day Christians. [8]
