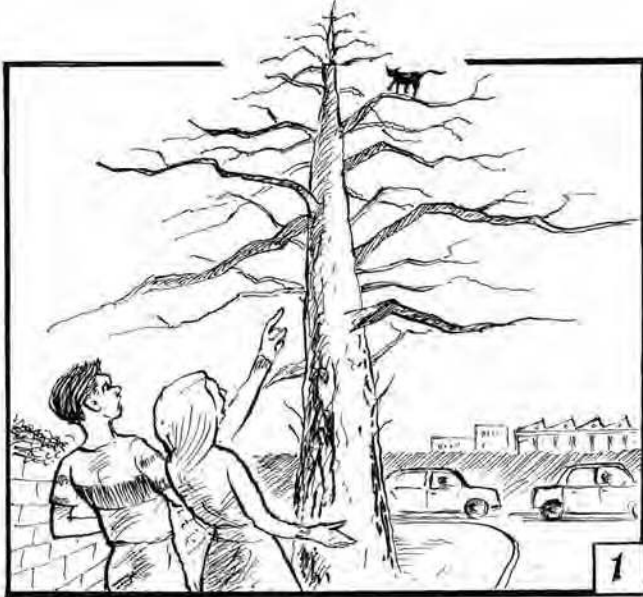

- 1 Ecrivez en français une composition d'environ 150 mots sur l'histoire racontée dans la série d'images suivante. Vous devez écrire au **passé**. Si vous le voulez vous pouvez imaginer que vous êtes l'un des personnages de l'histoire.



2 Ecrivez en français une composition d'environ 150 mots sur l'un des thèmes suivants:

- (a) Un oncle riche vous a envoyé une somme d'argent importante pour votre anniversaire. Ecrivez-lui une lettre pour lui dire merci.

Mentionnez: vos remerciements; ce que vous avez déjà fait avec une partie de l'argent; pourquoi; ce que vous voulez faire avec le reste de son cadeau; comment vous avez passé le jour de votre anniversaire.

- (b) Vous avez fait votre première visite chez votre correspondant(e) dans un pays étranger. Pendant le voyage de retour, vous parlez à un jeune homme/une jeune fille qui, lui/elle aussi, rentre dans son pays. Ecrivez **la conversation seulement**.

Mentionnez: vos expériences et activités pendant votre séjour; vos impressions du pays; les expériences du jeune homme/de la jeune fille.

Voici le début:

“Oui, je rentre d'un séjour très intéressant ..”

Continuez la conversation.

- (c) En vous promenant en ville, vous avez trouvé un portefeuille sur le trottoir. Racontez l'incident.

Mentionnez: votre première réaction; ce que vous avez fait; le propriétaire du portefeuille; sa réaction et la suite de l'incident.

Voici le début:

“En voyant le portefeuille .....”

Continuez l'histoire.

3 Traduisez en **français**:

Jean Duval was spending his holidays at a hotel in Bordeaux in France. He had arrived there two days before and he had enjoyed himself during that time. He found that there were a lot of interesting things to do.
