- 1 (a) Describe **two** features of Muhammad's character that impressed Khadija. [4]
- (b) Explain how Abu Talib's care helped to develop Muhammad's character. [10]
- (c) Discuss how the Prophet's experience of living with Abu Talib can help Muslims to provide care for others. [6]

- 2 (a) Give **four** ways in which nomadic people lived in Pre-Islamic Arabia. [4]
- (b) Describe the way tribes in Pre-Islamic society treated women, slaves and children. [10]
- (c) To what extent did the position of women improve with the coming of Islam? Give reasons to support your answer. [6]

- 3 (a) Describe **two** features of the Prophet's character in Mecca when dealing with others. [4]
