- (i) Peter and John, **and**
 - (ii) Paul. [6]
- (b) Explain the different ways in which people reacted to healing miracles in the Acts of the Apostles. [6]
- (c) 'The miracles in the Acts of the Apostles are literally true and happened as recorded.'
- To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view. [8]
- 2 (a) Give an account of what happened when Ananias and Sapphira met Peter. [6]
- (b) Explain what could be learnt about life in the early church from the Acts of the Apostles. [6]
- (c) 'The spread of the early church only happened because of persecution.'
- To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view. [8]
- 3 (a) Give an account of what happened to Saul (Paul) in Damascus following his experience on the Damascus road. [6]
- (b) Explain the events that
- (i) led Paul to go to Troas, **and**
 - (ii) caused him to leave almost immediately. [6]
- (c) 'Paul took his message to the Gentiles rather than to the Jews.'
- To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view. [8]

- 4 (a) Give an account of what happened at Paphos on Paul's first missionary journey. [6]
- (b) Explain what could be learnt about John Mark from the Acts of the Apostles. [6]
- (c) 'The first missionary journey was a great success.'
- To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view. [8]
- 5 (a) Give an account of the debate at the Council of Jerusalem up until the point when James made a judgement. [6]
- (b) Explain the content of the letter which was sent out to the whole church following the debate. [6]
- (c) 'The early church was full of tensions and disputes.'
- To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view. [8]
- 6 (a) Give an account of what happened when
- (i) Jason was brought in front of the city officials at Thessalonica, **and**
- (ii) Paul was brought in front of Gallio, the proconsul, in Corinth. [6]
- (b) Explain why the early Christians met so much opposition from some of the Jews. [6]
- (c) 'According to the Acts of the Apostles, the civil authorities (e.g. magistrates, city leaders) were friends rather than persecutors of the early Christians.'
- To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view. [8]
