3	(a)	Give a full account of the events at Caesarea Philippi. [6
	(b)	What does Jesus teach in Matthew's Gospel about the "Church"? [6
	(c)	'Matthew was writing to Jewish Christians.'  To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view.
4	(a)	Give a full account of Jesus' entry into the Temple immediately after he had entered Jerusalem [6
	(b)	Explain who the Sadducees were and what they believed. [6
	(c)	'The Sadducees and Pharisees opposed Jesus only because they were jealous of his popularity with the people.'  To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one
