Core theme: Being human

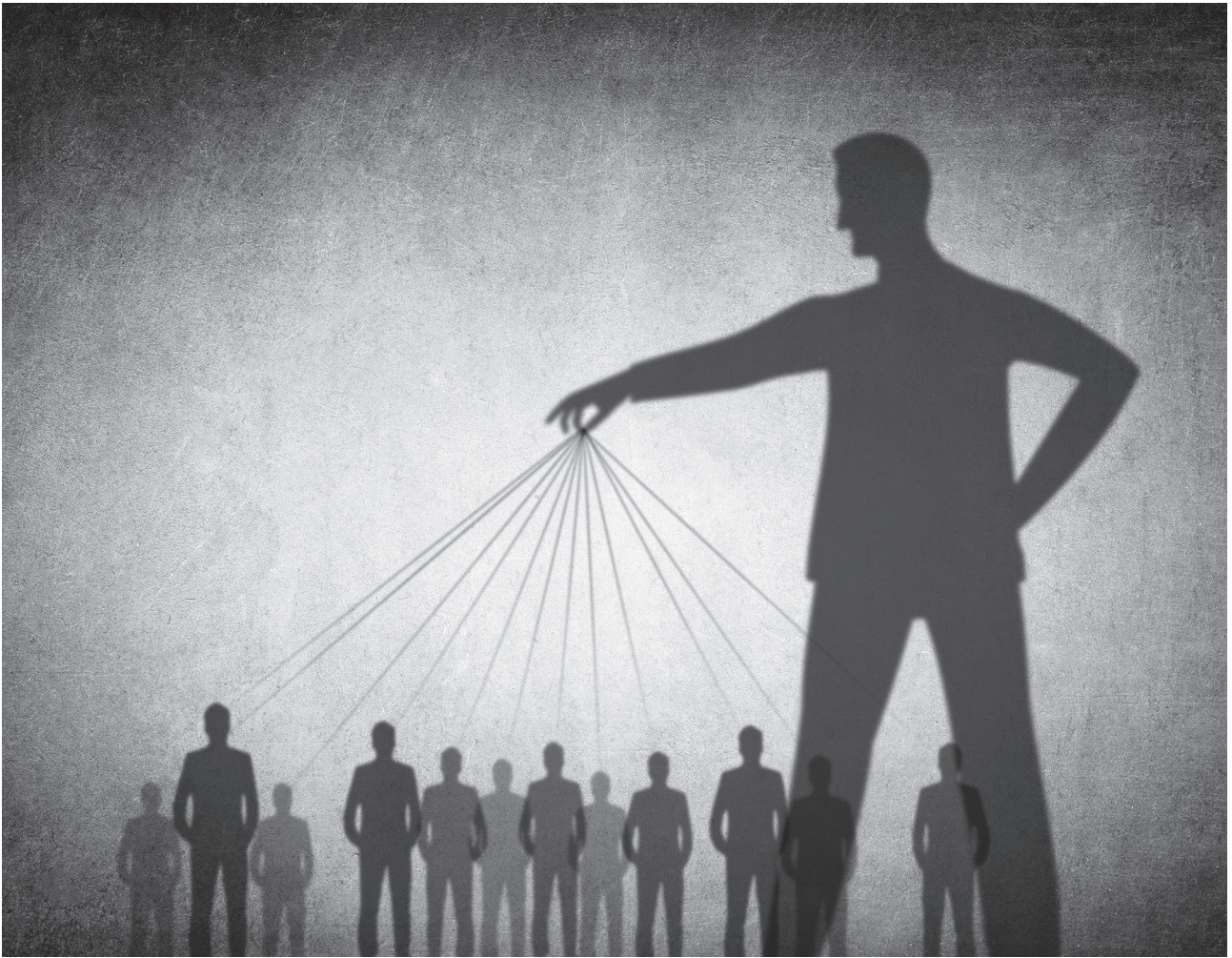
1. Read the following text and develop your response as indicated below.

I thought that the hormonal impact of pregnancy was a one-time, temporary event, to enable the baby to grow. Then, once out, I would recover. Not a big deal, basically.

What I saw portrayed about early motherhood did not relate to what I experienced, which was that I myself changed. I was altered, rewired, metamorphosed. I was also—and this was a shock—vulnerable, just like our baby.

14. Evaluate the view that defining universal human rights is becoming increasingly difficult in a world of competing interests, values and cultures.

15. Evaluate the claim that globalization impacts on cultural identity and social cohesion.
